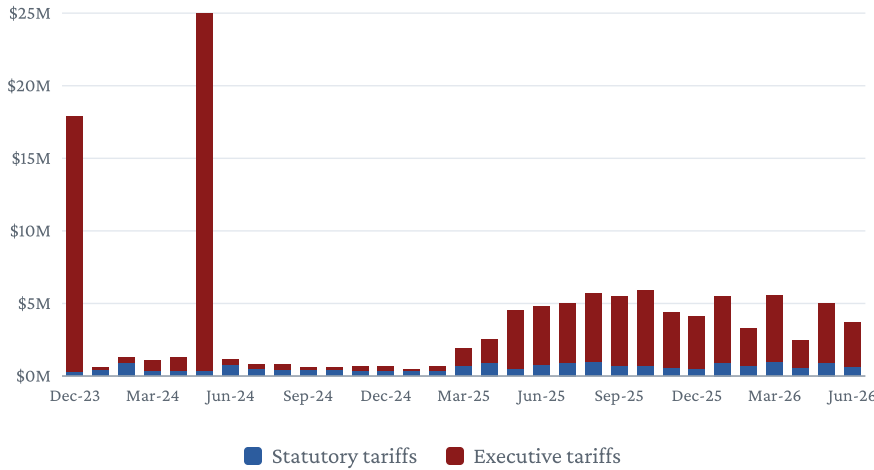

Estimated Tariffs on Imports into District of Columbia

Key District of Columbia Imports Facing Executive Tariffs

Food & beverages	\$8M	11.5%	18× the 2024 rate of 0.6%
Clothes & shoes	\$7M	25.7%	1.9× the 2024 rate of 13.8%
Metal products	\$4M	12.5%	1.6× the 2024 rate of 7.9%
Electrical equipment	\$4M	14.8%	11× the 2024 rate of 1.4%

Methodology. Figures are estimates of tariffs paid on imports into District of Columbia, split between statutory tariffs and executive tariffs imposed by presidential action, of which \$58 million has been imposed since January 2025.
