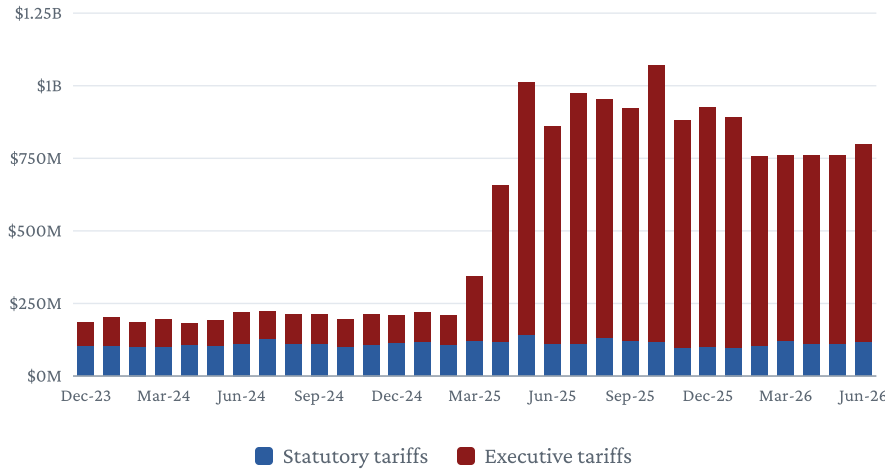

# Florida

## Estimated Tariffs on Imports into Florida

## Key Florida Imports Facing Executive Tariffs

| IMPORT CATEGORY                | EXTRA TARIFFS PAID SINCE JAN. 2025 | AVG. TARIFF, JULY 2025–JUNE 2026 | VS. 2024 RATE                     |
|--------------------------------|------------------------------------|----------------------------------|-----------------------------------|
| Food & beverages               | <b>\$2B</b>                        | 9.0%                             | 9× the 2024 rate of <b>1.0%</b>   |
| Cars & trucks                  | <b>\$1.8B</b>                      | 16.0%                            | 7.4× the 2024 rate of <b>2.2%</b> |
| Steel, aluminum & other metals | <b>\$534M</b>                      | 6.1%                             | 2.5× the 2024 rate of <b>2.4%</b> |
| Clothes & shoes                | <b>\$499M</b>                      | 18.6%                            | 2.1× the 2024 rate of <b>8.8%</b> |

**Methodology.** Figures are estimates of tariffs paid on imports into Florida, split between statutory tariffs and executive tariffs imposed by presidential action, of which \$12 billion has been imposed since January 2025. Estimates allocate national import and duty data to states; they are updated quarterly.
