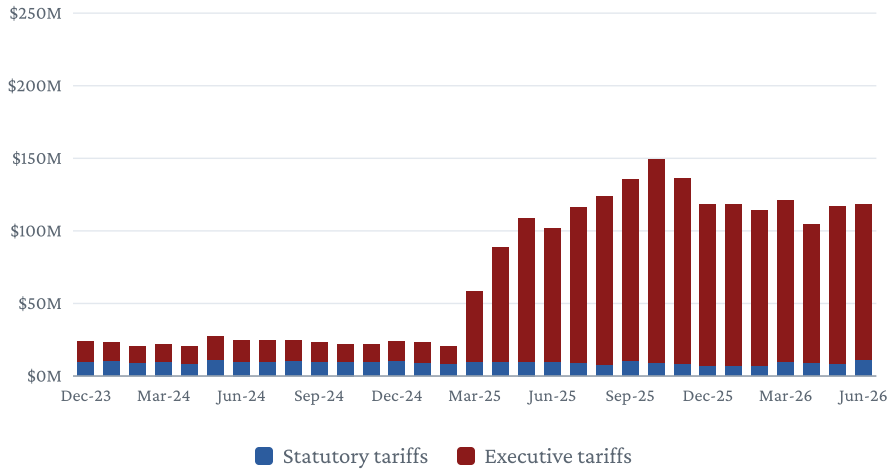

Methodology. Figures are estimates of tariffs paid on imports into Iowa, split between statutory tariffs and executive tariffs imposed by presidential action, of which \$1.7 billion has been imposed since January 2025.
