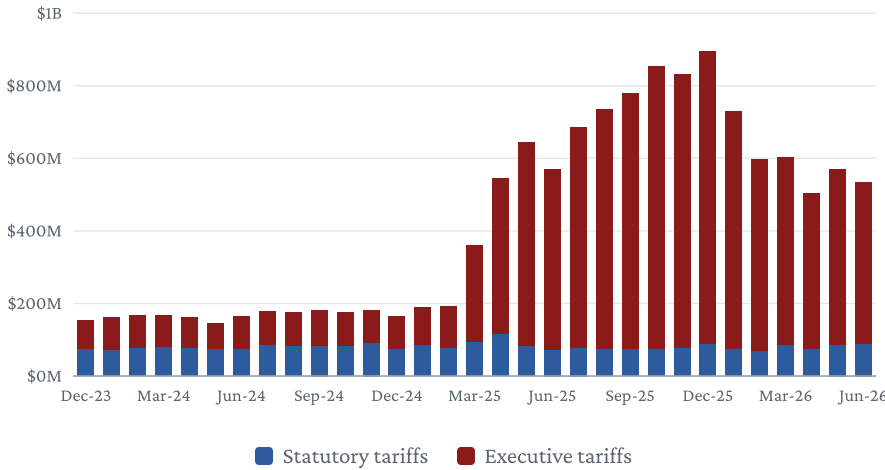

Key South Carolina Imports Facing Executive Tariffs

Auto parts	\$1.2B	14.8%	4× the 2024 rate of 3.7%
Machinery & parts	\$675M	18.9%	8.8× the 2024 rate of 2.2%
Electrical equipment	\$577M	15.9%	4.1× the 2024 rate of 3.9%
Household goods	\$435M	24.3%	3.3× the 2024 rate of 7.5%

Methodology. Figures are estimates of tariffs paid on imports into South Carolina, split between statutory tariffs and executive tariffs imposed by presidential action, of which \$9.3 billion has been imposed since January 2025.
