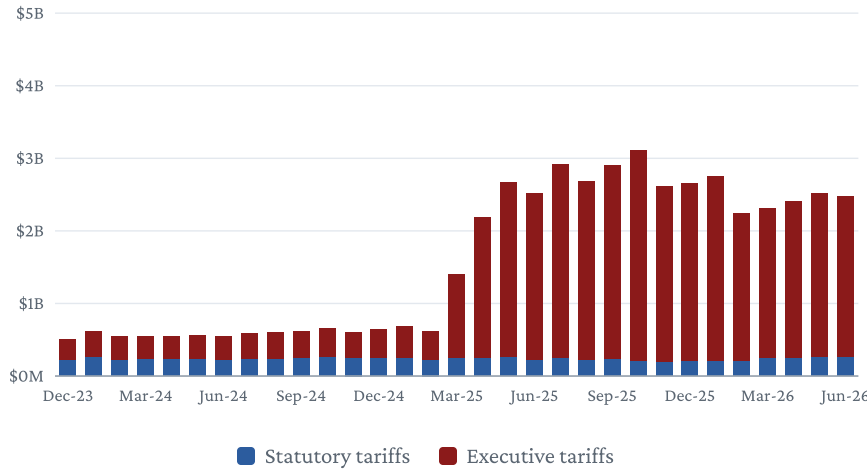

Key Texas Imports Facing Executive Tariffs

Cars & trucks	\$5.7B	14.7%	23× the 2024 rate of 0.6%
Steel, aluminum & other metals	\$3.3B	26.7%	9.3× the 2024 rate of 2.9%
Metal products	\$2.2B	34.5%	6.4× the 2024 rate of 5.4%
Electrical equipment	\$2.1B	10.2%	3.6× the 2024 rate of 2.9%

Methodology. Figures are estimates of tariffs paid on imports into Texas, split between statutory tariffs and executive tariffs imposed by presidential action, of which \$37 billion has been imposed since January 2025.
